



## Lindsay Tuer

Lindsay Tuer is a genetic counsellor newly relocated to her hometown of Calgary and currently working with the Machado Joseph Disease Foundation of Australia. This role was created through her position as the principal genetic counsellor to the Northern Territory of Australia (2016 – 2021) after a combined Biology & Psychology degree at the University of Victoria (2008) and a Master of Genetic Counselling at the University of Melbourne (2012). Lindsay's work has involved travelling to highly remote Aboriginal Australian Communities with a focus on the development of culturally appropriate genetic counselling education materials, and research investigating disparity in access to clinical genetic health services for Aboriginal Australians.
